What are the PSAT & National Merit Scholarship?

What is the PSAT, anyway?

- The PSAT is essentially a practice run at the SAT, especially for freshmen and sophomores.
- For juniors, it's an **opportunity to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship**, depending on their score.
- For younger students, it can be used in an application for competitive summer programs.
- The PSAT is **not a college admissions test** like the SAT and ACT.
- The PSAT is **extremely similar to the SAT** but with fewer potential points because it is slightly less difficult.
- Still, a PSAT score is universally considered an accurate indicator of an SAT score.
- The PSAT is offered in October every year, typically through a student's school.




Does the PSAT matter?



Some selective high schools will use a student's 8th-grade PSAT as a placement test.

Otherwise, this is an opportunity to get familiar with the test and assess your strengths and weaknesses going into high school.



Some selective summer and pre-college programs will consider a student's 10th-grade PSAT when making admissions decisions.

Otherwise, this is another practice opportunity and can gauge a student's ability to achieve National Merit

Qualifying Scores.

PSAT / NMSQT

Students who score in the top 1% in their state are eligible for the National Merit Scholarship.

For everyone else, this is an opportunity to establish a baseline score before taking an official SAT/ACT in Junior year.



What is the National Merit Scholarship?

- Initial eligibility based on a junior's
 PSAT score.
- Cutoff varies from state to state.
- Semi-finalists need to take several additional steps, including a "confirmation score" on a national ACT or SAT, to move on as finalists.
- Several colleges give away automatic scholarships, including full-rides, to semi-finalists, finalists, and winners.





HOW TO BECOME A NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLAR



PSAT

Take the PSAT in
October of Junior year
and score in the top
1% in the state.




Semi-finalist

Students find out if they qualify as semi-finalists in September of their senior year. If they qualify, they must apply for finalist status.



SAT/ACT

Students must take the SAT or ACT and **send their scores** to the National Merit Organization.



Scholarship

Students are
awarded the status
of "Finalist" and can
then receive
scholarships.
